At the Larry Johnson program the youth from Trinity Christian Academy in Lubbock helped act out the Bible story teaching kids about the dangers of sin. Our verse for the week was, "There is a way that seems right to people, but it leads to death." The **lesson was almost tragically illustrated** when a seven year old girl, leaving the program, ran ahead of her mom and out into the street in front of a pickup truck. The truck hit Julie, but she survived with only a broken leg. When we checked back in on her, delivering a pink teddy bear and a game, she was already bouncing around on her foot with the cast. Please pray that the enemy will keep his hands off the Metro Kidz and that these kids will sense God's hand on their lives.
